

Pollution Incident Response Plan

Contact Details

The Emergency Controller must immediately call 000 if the incident presents an immediate threat to human health or property. Fire and Rescue NSW, the NSW Police and the NSW Ambulance Service are the first responders, as they are responsible for controlling and containing incidents. If the incident does not require an initial combat agency, or once the 000 call has been made, notify the Environmental Officer who will immediately notify the relevant authorities in the following order

- The EPA – phone Environment Line on 131 555
- The Ministry of Health – During normal work hours phone 9391 9000 or after hours phone 02 4295 2500 (Shellharbour Hospital) and ask for the Public Health Officer on call
- The SafeWork NSW Authority – phone 13 10 50
- Shellharbour City Council – 4221 6111
- Fire and Rescue NSW – 4295 1940 (Shellharbour Fire Station)

Communicating with Neighbours and the Local Community

In the unlikely event of a pollution incident at the site, the pollutant would be prevented from entering the waterways using a bund or settling ponds. If the pollutant was still able to enter the waterway, Cleary Bros would notify the neighbour who keeps horses downstream of the quarry by telephone (the Quarry Production Manager has this neighbour's contact details). It is not considered that any other neighbour or member of the local community would be affected by a pollution incident at the site.
